


Cancer in Northeast New Mexico 1,626 Estimated New Cancers in 2023

Colfax, Guadalupe, Harding, Los Alamos, Mora, Rio Arriba, San Miguel, Santa Fe, Taos, Union Counties

- The **largest city** in the region is Santa Fe with a population of about 89,000
- 43% of the population lives in **rural** areas
- The **frontier** counties in the region are Guadalupe, Harding, Mora, Rio Arriba, San Miguel, and Union Counties with fewer than 7 persons per square mile
- 25% of the population is **65 years old or older**
- Access to primary care is limited with most counties defined as either partial
 or whole county shortage areas; however, Los Alamos County is not defined
 as a shortage area
- 92% of the population speaks English very well, and 39% of the population speaks a **language** other than English at home

71% of women ages 50-74 years had a mammogram within the last 2 years as compared to **75%** of New Mexico overall









Cancer in Northeast New Mexico




247 estimated new prostate cancer cases in 2023

24% of men are 65 years old or older as compared to 17% of men in New Mexico overall



142 estimated new colorectal cancer cases in 2023

69% of people ages 50-75 years are up-to-date on colorectal cancer screening as compared to **69%** of New Mexico overall



116 estimated new lung cancer cases in 2023

11% of adults currently smoke cigarettes as compared to **13%** of New Mexico overall
